Resilient leaders understand their stakeholder priorities and the organizations critical processes. They include department supervisors to C-suite executives, they enable continuity and ensure operational resilience through thoughtful preparedness activities.

These leaders focus on the whole organization, even departments that may not directly support critical processing need to be resilient; the mail room for example may provide essential information that critical departments depend on. Managers at all levels of the organization should thoroughly understand their business activities and how they support or are dependent on other organizational processes (critical or not).
